POLLARD MARKER INSTALLED!

By the time you read this, there will have been placed a historical marker for Pollard at the junction of the Old Pollard Road (Old Highway 29) and U. S. Highway 31. The marker was placed on March 15, and its text reads as follows:

SITE OF POLLARD - Located 12 miles south, town of Follard established 1861 at juncture of Alabama & Florida and Mclile and Great Northern Railroads named for Charles T. Pollard, founder of the Alabama & Florida.

One of largest military training camps of Confederacy located here during Civil War. Also site of major Confederate stores depot. Town suffered much destruction in Union raids of December 1864 and March 1865.

Served as first county seat of Escambia County from 1863 until 1883 when county government moved to Brewton.

This marker will be located on the East side of U. S. Highway 31 near its junction with the Old Pollard Road. The placement of this monument is the first in a series of such markers planned for erection in Escambia County through the combined efforts of the Escambia County Historical Society, The Alabama Historical Association, and the Thomas E. HoHillan museum.

Leslie Warren Watson was born in Georgiana Butler County Alabama on May 29, 1910 to Dr. Robert Hunter Watson and Myra Irene Cook. There were three brothers William, Hunter, Hilton.

He attended school in Georgiana, College Auburn Alabama and married Norma Green November 11, 1934 at Greenville Alabama. One daughter Claire was born August 21, 1936 in Selma Alabama. Two grandchildren, Susan Sorrells was born in Tampa Florida July 21, 1959, Steve Sorrells in Winter Park Florida August 2, 1963.

Leslie owned Dr. Pepper Bottling Plant Troy Alabama for 20 years. He sold plant and established Watson Sales Company for states of Alabama and Florida. He was president of Alabama Bottlers Association and Troy Kiwanis Club in 1948. He served on board of directors Alabama Bottlers Association and Florida Bottlers Association. Also on National Harketing Board of Dr. Pepper Company Dallas Texas. He was selected "Man of the Year" by Alabama Bottlers Association in 1971. He also served on Board of Stewards First Methodist Church Troy. His hobbies were hunting and fishing.

He died April 10, 1980 in Orlando Florida. Funeral services were held in Troy Alabama and Winter Park Florida, Burial in Glen Haven Memorial Park Winter Park Florida.

Survivors are - Norma Green Vatson, Claire Watson Thompson - Susan Sorrells, Steven Sorrells. Brothers - Munter, Milton.

FRBIE CECIL GREEN

Erbie Cecil Green was born in Castleberry Alabama July 9, 1887 to James Rankin Green and Clara Brewton. His grandparents were William Pickney Green and Ann Trice Castleberry, William Johnson and Sarah (Sally) Emily Weaver. Great grandparents John Weaver and Maria Price, Emanual Brewton and Caroline Bacon. Brothers and sisters Albert, Madie, Arthur, Hassett, Sally, Inez, Cartledge, Laura, Annie, Lizzie.

He attended School in Castleberry Alabama and was agent and telegraph operator for L and M Railroad. They moved to Pollard Alabama in 1926 then to Georgiana Alabama 1931. He retired and moved to Haines City Florida.

He was a member of the First Hethodists Church Castleberry, Masonic Lodge and Eastern Star. He also served on school board in Castleberry.

Brbie married Norma Cleo Davis October 4, 1906. There were five children Norma, Frances, Cecil, Annie, David. His hobbies were hunting and fishing. He also gathered all the children in the neighborhood around him. They called him Daddy Green.

He died in Haines City Florida October 15, 1969. Funeral and burial in Haines City.
