

HOTICE OF MEETING

The Escambia County Mistorical Society will hold its regular meeting on Tuesday, May 19, 1982 at 7:00 P.M. at the Thomas E. McMillan Museum on the campus of Jefferson Davis State Junior College in Previon.

This month's speaker will be Mr. Bob Cason, of the Alabama Department of Archives and History in Montgomery. Mr. Cason is a curator in the State museum section and is serving as acting director of Archives and History due to the recent death of Mr. Milo Howard. Mr. Cason is past president of the Alabama Museums Association and is very active in statewide programs whose goals are to improve the services and interinstitutional cooperation of this state's museums.

Mir. Cason will address the Society about present and planned future improvements and changes within the Archives and Distory facility.

FORT CRAWFORD MARKER PLANNED

Plans are now underway to apply for and place an historical marker designating the site of Old Fort Crawford (1017-1019) in East Brewton. This marker, which would be identical in style to the one recently placed near Follard, is tentatively planned for placement at or near the intersection of Highways 29-61 and Ridge Road in the immediate vicinity of Horton's Plaza in East Brewton. Last month's neeting featured a program entitled, "Cld Hats Review", when a collection of twenty-four hats of yesteryear, loaned to the Society by a charter member, were modeled as in a fashion show by six of the ECHS ladies.

The oldest hat featured was purchased in 1907; the newest, in 1927. Some had the quality of having been hand made. Marration was included with information given about the styles, brand names, dates, and descriptions of the hats being shown.

MUSEUM HEWS

A showing of the photographs of students currently enrolled in Jefferson Davis College's Studio Photography course will be featured during the month of May.

A collection of cameras is being developed quite rapidly. Mr. Hank Locklin, of McLellan, Florida has donated a 1923-1927 Modak folding bellows camera and a portable stereo camera of the 1915 period; Oscar and Maxine Wynn, of Ozark, Alabama, have donated a 1901 patent panorama camera as well as some fine examples of popular, "snap-shot" cameras of the 1946-1950s era. The museum is still seeking used and antique photographic equipment both for exhibition and for use in its classes as instructional examples; we thank those who have donated their materials for their support and generousity.
