
During the 1993-1994 school year from September, 1993 to August, 1994, there were 119 recorded visitors to the Alabama Room. Not all visitors remember to sign the register, so the actual usage is higher.

Society members will be interested to know that researchers came from the following states during 1993-94 to research family names or local history:

To date, during September and October, 1994, there have been 24 visitors from the three states of Alabama, Florida and Illinois.
