HISTORY OF 1867 LOG HOUSE

The log house is a preservation project of the Flomaton Research Club. Donated by Roger Green and Mike Edwards, it was moved from its original sits (behind the IGA Food Store in Century, Florida) to Flomaton Lions Park during May, 1972.

Relocating the log house in Lions
Park was engineered by L. D.
Weaver. The restoration was done
by J. R. Collins with assistance from
the ladies of the Research Club.

The house was built by Hiram H. Renfroe, his brother Warren, and an Indian in 1867. Logs were hand hewn, wedged, and pinned. The original chimney was made of stick, dirt, and native ironstone as is the present one.

The cypress shingles were cut from regional trees by a local sawmill. The rail fence is constructed as were fences in the 1800's. The simulated well is also made of native ironstone and covered with cypress singles.

Hiram and Deliah Jane Leslie were married January 10, 1867; he was 23, she was 19. They were the parents of 10 children, including one set of twins; all of whom were born and reared in this house. Lonnie, the first born, arrived in 1867 before

the walls were completed. It is of note that these 10 children were born over a period of 24 years.

During the typhoid epidemic of 1897, the Renfroes fled from this house to a safer area near the river's edge. They returned to the log house, and members of the Renfroe family resided in it for a span of 96 years until the death of Hiram and Deliah's daughter "Miss Leona" in 1963.

A local resident recalls that a Wright Brothers' plane landed in front of the house in 1912.

It is hoped that you will pause quietly as you tour the log house and be able to hear the crackling of the falling timbers that Hiram, Warren, and the Indian brave felled 128 years ago to build this house.
