## MONTHLY REPORT ON THE ALABAMA ROOM AT JDJC FROM ANN BIGGS WILLIAMS

Since January 2, 1996, there have been 40 visitors who have registered in the Alabama Room at the Jefferson Davis Community College's Brewton campus library. These visitors came locally from Alabama and also from Florida, Colorado, and Texas.

The majority of visitors were engaged in genealogical research and recorded the following family names that were being studied: Brooks, Burnham, Bush, Colvin, Davis, Hill, Hoomes, Jackson, Jernigan, Johnson, Kennedy, Kent, Langley, McCormick, Maddox, Miller, Morris, Nelson, Parker, Penton, Steward, Taylor, Tippin, Wiggins, and Windham.

Two visitors were engaged in historical research. In January, a Dr. Michael Thomason from the University of South Alabama came to take photos of the mastheads of older county newspapers to

use in a photography display on the timber industry at the turn of the century.

In February, a writer, Mr. Willie Drye from Port St. Lucie, Florida used the newspapers from 1935 to 1945 for World War II ear research.

Virginia Coleman, a JDJC student, volunteered approximately ten hours in Jan. and Feb. in the Alabama Room recording bibliographical information on the society's books and stamping the books with an ownership stamp that identifies the books as belonging to the "Escambia County Historical Society." The library staff then typed a three page listing of these 167 books.

As previously reported, the college library will be closed for spring holidays March 25-29, 1996.
