Two-story building at right is the Bank of Flomaton, Flomaton's first bank. It was located on the west side of Palafox in the first block north of the railroad. It opened in 1906 but closed in 1924. The officers were W. J. Bryan, president; Alex McGowin, Jr., vice-president; Roberden W. Drury, cashier; William Townsend and T.J. Farris, directors. A drug store and city hall occupied a portion of the first floor for a while.
