Burnt Corn, AL – On September 17, 2011, from 8:00 am to 2:30 pm, Monroe County Heritage Museum will host a program on the Old Federal Road to bring attention to the community of Burnt Corn and its connection to the Battle of Burnt Corn Creek as the precursor to the Creek Indian War of 1813-1814.

The morning will begin at 8:00 am at Bethany Baptist Church in Burnt Corn with coffee and refreshments, followed by informed discussions on the historical events and genealogies associated with Monroe County sites along the Old Federal Road. Renowned Federal Road scholars, Dr. Greg Waselkov and Dr. Kathryn Braund, will provide a virtual tour down the road with their extensive collections of research files and images. Following a catered lunch on the church grounds, Dr. James Brown will provide commentary during a guided bus tour of the Old Federal Road through Monroe County. **Program is free to the public, but pre-registration is required due to limited seating.** This event is made possible by Auburn University through the Alabama Cooperative Extension.
